Based on a curriculum rooted in an orthodox understanding of Scripture, the program moves beyond theory into real-world practice, preparing a new generation to shine light in a divided world and help shape a better future.

To advance this work, we invite colleges and universities affiliated with the CCCU and HBCUs to partner with us by nominating students to participate in this week-long, immersive fellowship experience. By identifying students who demonstrate leadership potential, a commitment to human dignity, and a desire to engage difference with grace, institutions can play a vital role in forming the next generation of leaders.

ELIGIBILITY

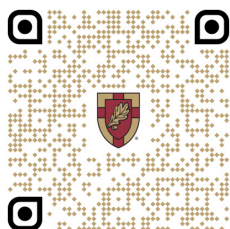
- Current College Student: Enrolled in an accredited undergraduate program for the fall semester following the summer fellowship.

NOMINATIONS

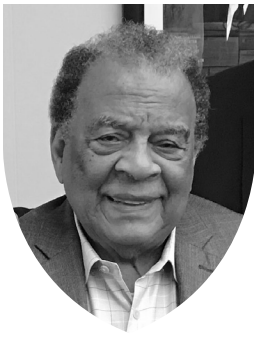
- Institutional leaders are invited to nominate students by March 15, 2026, via the nomination form on our website.
